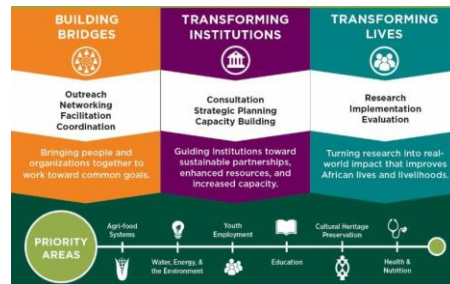

Trevor Noah at the Wharton Center!

South African Comedian and Social Commentator to Hit the Stage This Fall

Presented by MSU College of Arts & Letters Signature Lecture Series

Trevor Noah is the host of the Emmy and Peabody Award-winning *The Daily Show* on Comedy Central and has been part of the show since 2014 when he was a contributor. Noah's comedy specials have sold more DVDs than any other standup on the African continent, and his last one-hour special: *Lost in Translation* was released on Comedy Central. In November 2016, Trevor released his first book *Born a Crime: Stories from a South African Childhood*, which was an instant New York Times bestseller. It is a collection of personal stories about growing up in South Africa during the last gasps of apartheid and the tumultuous days of freedom that came with its demise. The book was nominated for two NAACP Image Awards, one for Outstanding Literary Work by a Debut Author and another for Outstanding Literary Work in the Biography/Auto-Biography category

A group of South African museum and cultural heritage workers are visiting MSU from September 11-13 as part of the *Ubuntu* project funded by the MSU Alliance for African Partnership initiative. The group will include representatives from the Robben Island Museum, Stellenbosch University Museum, Desmond and Leah Tutu Legacy Foundation, Lwandile Migrant Labour Museum, Dreamfuel, and artist who created iMadiba, an installation sculpture that replicates the footprint of Mr. Mandela's cell and is intended to be a space for difficult conversations.

MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY will host the sixth annual graduate student research conference on migration, welcoming papers on the theme Migration With(out) Boundaries. Migration Studies is a burgeoning and all too-relevant area of academic attention, and the conference brings together a cohort of scholars working on any thematic, conceptual, spatial, or temporal aspect of human migration from any disciplinary perspective. Submissions are welcome from academics at any stage of their graduate career, and may include research designs, dissertation or thesis chapters, methodological models, works in progress, and preliminary findings.

Paper sessions will take place on Saturday, October 7. Michigan State University faculty representing the field of migration studies across numerous disciplines and departments will serve as discussants.
